

HOSPICE ADMISSION SOFTWARE

We're not replacing your EMR. We're replacing the binder.

Every hospice admission turns on the same three documents — the Medicare election consent, the state life-sustaining treatment order, and your admission consent. They live in a binder, get signed on paper, and get photographed when somebody needs a copy. That's the part we fixed. Everything else you already own stays exactly where it is.

WHAT IT DOES

- **Signs on a tablet.** The patient or family draws a real signature with a finger — which is what Medicare's contractors expect, not a typed name.
- **Works with no signal.** Packets are filled and saved in the home, on the device, whether or not there's a bar.
- **Prints exactly like the paper.** Because sometimes a paramedic needs it on the fridge.
- **Picks up where you left off.** Start an admission Tuesday, finish it Thursday.

WHAT IT DOESN'T DO

- **It isn't an EMR.** No charting, no billing, no quality submissions. Keep whatever you run today.
- **It doesn't touch your claims.** Nothing here can affect how you get paid.
- **It isn't your system of record.** Your chart stays the official one.
- **It doesn't hold your patients' data.** See the note below — that one is deliberate.

THE PART THAT ISN'T THE SIGNATURE

- 1 **It refuses a retroactive election date.** 42 CFR § 418.24 forbids one; most software will happily let you type it.
- 2 **It counts your 5-day Notice of Election clock** from the admission date and shows you the deadline.
- 3 **It won't let "attempt to resuscitate" sit next to anything but full treatment** on the life-sustaining treatment order. On paper, nothing catches that.
- 4 **It hides the section only a patient may complete** unless that patient has decision-making capacity.
- 5 **It asks for a second physician when the patient is a minor**, because the state requires two.

Anyone can put a signature on a PDF. Almost nobody encodes the rules — and the rules are what a surveyor asks about.

WHERE YOUR PATIENTS' INFORMATION LIVES

On your tablet, and nowhere else. No server, no account, nothing sent to us. The moment a vendor holds signed hospice forms it is handling protected health information and needs a Business Associate Agreement and HIPAA-eligible hosting — we are building toward that properly rather than claiming it early. Meanwhile your device's own passcode and encryption protect those packets, so treat the tablet like the binder, and use the Export button for anything you need to keep.

Run it beside your paper process and tell us where it's wrong. We built it from the regulations; you've done this hundreds of times.

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
